Notes on the index:

This index is aimed at those using the Chronicles to research British or local history, and contains people, places, and events relevant for this purpose. To avoid the index being almost as long as the Chronicles themselves, I have only included church personnel where they are relevant to British or local history.

The index references are the year of the entry as given in the Chronicles. Please note that the years indicated in the Chronicles do not necessarily tally with actual years of occurrence.

Subheadings for people and kingdoms are generally in chronological order (sometimes within broad categories). Subheadings for other entries are generally in alphabetical order.
